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# LEGAL INFORMATION

## Standards of Classical Homeopathy

## 1. Website Administrator and Data Controller

## 2. Website Terms of Use

**§1. General Provisions** This document sets out the terms governing the use of the website dedicated to the Standards of Classical Homeopathy. The website is informational, educational, and contact-oriented in nature. Use of the website constitutes acceptance of these terms insofar as they pertain to the use of the website.

**§2. Nature of the Website** The website serves to present the ideas, documents, assumptions, and materials related to the Standards of Classical Homeopathy. Content published on the website is exclusively informational, educational, and organisational in nature. The website does not serve the purpose of entering into online contracts, maintaining user accounts, or conducting online sales, unless expressly stated otherwise.

Content published on the website does not constitute medical, health, therapeutic, legal, or any other professional individual advice. Materials and information published on the website are of a general nature and cannot replace individual consultation with an appropriate specialist.

**§3. Terms of Use** The user undertakes to use the website in a manner consistent with the law, good practices, and the purpose of the website. The following are prohibited in particular:

- providing unlawful content,

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- taking actions that may disrupt the functioning of the website,
  - attempting to gain unauthorised access to the website or its resources,
  - using content published on the website in a manner contrary to its purpose, context, or applicable law.

**§4. Contact Form and Contact** The user may contact the administrator via the contact form or the contact details provided on the website. Sending a message does not constitute the conclusion of any contract or an obligation to conclude one. The administrator may respond to a message if its content permits and if the contact is justified.

Copying, distributing, modifying, adapting, or further using such content without the consent of the administrator or another entitled party is prohibited, except as permitted by applicable law.

**§6. Liability** The administrator endeavours to ensure that content published on the website is reliable, up to date, and presented with due care. At the same time, the administrator does not guarantee the completeness, usefulness, currency, or full suitability of all materials for the individual needs of the user.

All materials and information published on the website are used by the user entirely at their own risk. The administrator shall not be liable for any decisions, actions, omissions, damages, consequences, or effects arising from the use, application, interpretation, or reliance upon materials and information contained on the website.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the administrator shall not be liable for:

- the manner in which content available on the website is used by users or third parties,
- the consequences of decisions made on that basis,
- direct or indirect damages arising from the use of or inability to use the website,
- temporary unavailability of the website,
- technical errors, interruptions, unauthorised access, loss of data, or other disruptions beyond the administrator's control.

The administrator shall not be liable for use of the website in a manner contrary to the law, these Terms, or the purpose of the website.

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## 3. Privacy Policy

**§2. Scope of Data** Through the website, data voluntarily provided by the user may be processed, in particular:

- first name,
- e-mail address,
- telephone number,
- the content of a message sent via the contact form,
- other data voluntarily provided by the user in their message.

**§3. Purposes of Processing** Personal data may be processed for the purpose of:

- handling messages sent via the contact form or by e-mail,
- conducting correspondence,
- responding to questions or messages,
- protection against abuse and ensuring the security of the website,
- the possible establishment, pursuit, or defence of claims.

**§4. Legal Bases for Processing** Personal data are processed on the basis of:

- Article 6(1)(f) GDPR — the legitimate interests of the administrator, consisting in conducting correspondence, handling contact, protecting the website, and defending against claims,
- Article 6(1)(c) GDPR — where processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation,
- Article 6(1)(a) GDPR — where the user gives consent, to the extent covered by that consent.

**§5. Voluntary Nature of Data Provision** Providing data is voluntary but may be necessary in order to send a message and receive a response.

**§6. Recipients of Data** Data may be transferred to entities providing technical support for the operation of the website, e-mail, hosting, or the contact form — solely to the extent necessary for the operation of the website and the handling of contact.

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**§7. Retention Period** Data will be retained for the period necessary for the handling of correspondence, and thereafter for the time required for archiving or the defence of claims — no longer than necessary.

**§8. Rights of the Data Subject** The data subject has the right to:

- access their data,
- rectification of their data,
- erasure of their data,
- restriction of processing,
- object to processing,
- withdraw consent at any time, where data are processed on the basis of consent,
- lodge a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office (UODO).

**§9. Cookies** The website may use cookies necessary for its proper functioning. If analytical or marketing cookies are also used on the website, they are activated only upon obtaining the user's consent.

**§10. Amendments to the Privacy Policy** The administrator may update this privacy policy, in particular in the event of legal, organisational, or technical changes.

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## 5. Implementation of the Standards and Terms of Use

The Standards of Classical Homeopathy may serve as the basis for organising professional practice, the therapeutic process, communication, and decision-making in activities related to classical homeopathy.

We encourage individuals and entities for whom the values of responsibility, diligence, and ethics are important to use the Standards as a reference point in their activities and to co-create the direction of their further development.

The use of the Standards is voluntary and autonomous. Each entity implements them independently and bears full responsibility for the manner of their interpretation and application.

HomeoMe sp. z o.o. does not currently conduct processes of certification, accreditation, or formal verification of entities using the Standards.

### **Prohibition on Suggesting Support, Certification, or Endorsement**

The use of the Standards does not mean and may not be presented as:

- implementation carried out with the support of HomeoMe sp. z o.o.,
- implementation supervised, audited, or verified by HomeoMe sp. z o.o.,
- conformity confirmed by HomeoMe sp. z o.o.,
- obtaining certification, accreditation, recommendation, or authorisation,
- being in any formal relationship with HomeoMe sp. z o.o. or the Standards of Classical Homeopathy project.

Without the prior express consent of HomeoMe sp. z o.o., it is prohibited to suggest — directly or indirectly — that any person, entity, practice, clinic, organisation, school, course, training, service, product, or activity:

- implemented the Standards with the involvement of HomeoMe sp. z o.o.,
- operates on the basis of approval or supervision by HomeoMe sp. z o.o.,
- meets requirements confirmed by HomeoMe sp. z o.o.,
- has been assessed, accepted, placed under patronage, or in any way officially associated with HomeoMe sp. z o.o.

### **Prohibition on Communicating Affiliation or Official Association**

It is also prohibited to use the names of documents, terms, or communications that could suggest official cooperation, affiliation, conformity, or an organisational relationship with HomeoMe sp. z o.o., in particular in:

- marketing and informational materials,
- offers and service descriptions,
- communications with clients or patients,

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- social media,
  - websites,
  - terms and procedures,
  - training and courses,
  - certificates, recommendations, and references,

if this could create the impression that a given activity has been approved, supervised, or formally associated with HomeoMe sp. z o.o.

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
